RESOLUTION IN MEMORY OF
ARTHUR V. 'BINKS' HOLLOWAY, JR.

WHEREAS, *Arthur V. 'Binks' Holloway, Jr.*, a native and lifelong resident of Poquoson passed away on January 24, 2010; and

WHEREAS, prior to his death, *Arthur V. Holloway, Jr.* was a very active community leader serving with distinction on Poquoson City Council from July 1994 through January 2010, a period of fifteen years, during which time he served as Vice Mayor from January 2003 until his passing; and

WHEREAS, *Arthur V. Holloway, Jr.* was an active volunteer firefighter with the Poquoson Volunteer Fire Company serving at one time as the Assistant Chief and ultimately attaining life membership; and

WHEREAS, *Arthur V. Holloway, Jr.* served two full terms on the School Board from July 1982 through June 1988 during which time he was Vice Chairman from 1984 to 1985 and Chairman from 1986 to 1987; and

WHEREAS, *Arthur V. Holloway, Jr.* was a member of the Society of Naval Architects and Marine Engineers; Chairman of the Virginia Municipal League State Environmental Committee, a member of Tabernacle United Methodist Church, George W. Amos Men's Choir, past president of United Methodist Men, past Chair of the Council on Ministries, member of the Staff Parish Committee and an adult Sunday School teacher; and

WHEREAS, *Arthur V. Holloway, Jr.* will long be remembered and respected for his leadership and love for this community.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Poquoson Virginia:

Section 1: That the death of *Arthur V. 'Binks' Holloway, Jr.* is a distinct loss to the City of Poquoson and City Council does hereby express its deepest sympathies and condolences to his family.

Section 2: That his dedication, contributions, influence and leadership were invaluable and will be forever remembered by the members of City Council, the community and City staff.
